Two Diploma Paths

- TOPS University Diploma if you definitely want to attend a 4 year university after graduation and be *eligible* for TOPS Opportunity, Performance, or Honors. This coursework is required for admission to a 4 year university.
- 2) TOPS Tech JumpStart (Career Diploma) if you would like to attend a Community College, Technical School, or start a career after graduation. This track provides career courses and workplace experiences leading to industry certifications in career fields most likely to lead to high-wage jobs. Students can attend a 4 year college, but must first attend a community college first.

All students begin high school following the TOPS University diploma track, unless otherwise stated by parents. The decision to move from the TOPS University diploma to the Jump Start diploma will be made at the end of 9th grade or 10th grade year.

There are four current pathways with varies levels of credentialing and certifications to graduate.

Reminders

- Academic Dual enrollment through Southeastern and Northshore Technical College basic requirements: junior, 2.5 GPA, PreACT/ACT composite of an 18, Math sub-score of a 19 and English sub-score of 18.
- Technical Dual enrollment through Northshore Technical College requirement; 2.0 GPA, 15 sub-score in English and Math on the Pre-ACT or ACT.
- Academic DE fees are \$50 per credit. Livingston will cover up to 12 credits a year through SCA funds, parents are responsible for any cost over 12 credits. Technical DE is covered through TOPS Tech Early Start funds
- AP courses are on a 10 point grading scale and 5 point GPA scale. All students enrolled in an AP course is required to take the AP exam. AP exam fees vary yearly but may be as high as \$95. Maybe covered by the district.
